Now Streaming Mysteries & Crime Dramas

The A List - 2018 - This series blends romance, drama, suspense, and mystery when a group of young women go to a remote camp with a supernatural presence.

Broadchurch - 2013 to 2017 - When an 11-year-old boy is murdered in a quiet coastal community, town secrets are exposed. David Tennant (*Deadwater Fell*) and Olivia Colman (*Rev*) star.

Collateral - 2018 - When a pizza delivery man is gunned down in London, DI Kip Glaspie refuses to accept that it's just a random act of violence. Her investigation drags her into a dark underworld she never could have predicted. The series stars John Simm of *Life on Mars*, along with Nicola Walker (*River*), Billie Piper (*Doctor Who*), and Carey Mulligan (*Never Let Me Go*).

Criminal: United Kingdom - 2019 - This three-episode series takes a look at the intense interrogation of three different suspects in London. David Tennant makes an appearance in one episode.

Deadwind - *Finland* - 2018 to present - Detective Sofia Karppi investigates a murder with ties to a Helsinki construction firm.

The Five - 2016 - Years after a young boy disappears, his DNA turns up at a crime scene. Based on the novel by Harlen Coben.

The Frankenstein Chronicles - 2015 to 2017 - In 1827 London, a detective hunts a killer with an appetite for dismemberment.

Giri/Haji - 2019 - Japanese detective Kenzo Mori travels to London to figure out whether his brother Yuto, presumed dead, is actually dead. Yuto is believed to have killed the nephew of a Yakuza member, and the search draws Kenzo into the dark and dangerous criminal underworld of London.

Hinterland - 2013 to 2016 - This Welsh crime drama takes place in the coastal town of Aberystwyth, where DCI Tom Mathias is just getting started in a new job.

The Indian Detective - *Canada* - 2017 - A suspended Canadian police officer returns home to Mumbai and helps out with an investigation.

Intelligence - *Canada* - 2005 to 2007 - The female head of an organized crime unit faces off against the confident male leader of a drug-smuggling ring.

Kiss Me First – 2018 - Two girls become friends in the virtual world of an online game, and one is pulled into something much darker than she had imagined.

Lucifer - *United States* - 2016 to present - Though American, this Los Angeles-based procedural stars British actor Tom Ellis (*Miranda*). He plays Lucifer, the naughty son of God who's decided he's sick of Hell and wants to spend some time on Earth.

Marcella – 2016 to present - After her divorce, Marcella returns to work as a detective in London. A serial killer she once pursued may have done the same.

Paranoid – 2016 - What begins as a cozy British mystery quickly evolves into a massive European conspiracy.

Requiem – 2018 - After her mother commits suicide, a young woman finds evidence that might tie her to an abduction in Wales more than 20 years prior.

Retribution – 2016 - When a newlywed couple is killed, police question their feuding families and uncover more than they expected.

Ripper Street – 2012 to 2017 - This detective series is set in 1889 London in the aftermath of Jack the Ripper.

Safe – 2018 - Michael C. Hall (*Dexter*) tries on a British accent for his role in this series about a widowed surgeon whose teenage daughter goes missing.

Sherlock – 2010 to 2017 - Benedict Cumberbatch stars in this modern-day version of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's *Sherlock Holmes* tales.

The Stranger – 2020 - Based on the Harlan Coben novel of the same title, this series sees a mysterious stranger tell a man a secret that destroys his otherwise peaceful life.

Tidelands – *Australia* – 2018 - When an ex-con returns to her hometown, it brings long-hidden truths to the surface.

Traitors – 2019 - Near the end of World War II, a young English woman assists a mysterious American agent as he tries to root out Russian infiltration in the British government.

Vexed – 2010 to 2012 - A young male and female detective team frustrate each other with their different attitudes and complicated personal lives.

Wanted – *Australia* – 2016 to 2018 - Two strangers become involuntary partners when they witness a murder and get framed for the crime.

Young Wallander – 2020 - Though the Kenneth Branagh adaptation of Wallander left Netflix this year, Netflix made this new series, an adaptation that imagines Kurt Wallander as a police officer in his early 20s in 2020 Sweden.

Dramas

Alias Grace – *Canada* – 2017 - In 19th-century Canada, a murderess might be deemed not guilty by reason of insanity. This limited series is based on Margaret Atwood's novel.

Anne With An "E" – *Canada* – 2017 to 2019 - Based on Anne of Green Gables, this series follows a spirited young orphan who goes to live with a spinster.

Between – *Canada* – 2016 - When a strange disease kills every town resident over the age of 21, the youthful inhabitants of the town are quarantined.

Black Earth Rising – 2018 - Investigator Kate Ashby is forced to investigate her own past when she takes on war crimes cases.

Black Mirror – 2007 to 2019 - This ominous modern thriller anthology gives

us glimpses into some very dark possibilities for the future.

Black Mirror: Bandersnatch – 2018 - In 1984, a programmer adapts a novel into a video game, growing less connected to reality as the project moves along. This is an interactive story with multiple endings.

Bodyguard – 2018 - Keeley Hawes and Richard Madden star in this hit drama about a veteran who helps thwart a terrorist attack and gets assigned to protect a prominent politician.

The Borgias – *Canada* – 2011 to 2013 - This period drama follows the notorious and frequently unethical Borgia family.

Call the Midwife – 2012 to present - This drama looks into the lives of dedicated midwives in impoverished East London of

the 1950s and 60s.

Can't Cope, Won't Cope – *Ireland* – 2016 to 2018 - In Dublin, two young women realize their childish ways are wearing thin.

Cleverman – *Australia* – 2016 to 2017 - In a future world, powerful humanoid creatures try to survive in a world dominated by humans.

The Code – *Australia* - 2014 to 2016 - When two brothers, a hacker and a journalist, are facing the possibility of extradition to the US, the Australian National Security offers them a way out. They're taken to a government facility and told that if they help out, the slate will be wiped clean.

Creeped Out – 2017 to present - A masked figure known only as "The Curious" collects dark tales in this dramatic young adult anthology series.

The Crown – 2016 to present - This Netflix original follows some particularly dramatic times in Queen Elizabeth's reign during the last half of the 20th century. Claire Foy and Olivia Colman portray Queen Elizabeth II.

Dark Matter – *Canada* – Waking up on a spaceship with no memories, a crew must attempt to figure out who they are and how they got there.

Dead Set – 2008 - Housemates in a reality show are clueless as the undead attack the compound.

Degrassi : Next Class – *Canada* – 2016 to 2017 - This follow-up to the classic Canadian teen drama features a new generation of teenagers.

Doctor Foster – 2015 to 2017 - When a woman suspects her husband of having an affair, her investigations lead her down a dark path.

The End of the F*ing World** – 2017 to present - A rebel and a psychopath embark on a teenage road trip.

The English Game – 2020 - This sports-themed period drama was developed by Julian Fellowes (*Downton Abbey*) for Netflix, and it follows the origins of modern football in England. Set in the 1870s, it brings us to a time when football was considered a sport for the wealthy – until two players from opposite ends of the social spectrum come together to change the game forever.

Free Rein – 2017 to present - A teenager from LA spends the summer in England

and bonds with a mysterious horse. See also: *Free Rein: The 12 Neighs of Christmas* and *Free Rein: Valentine's Day*

Freud – *Austria* - 2020 - In 1886 Vienna, a young Sigmund Freud hasn't yet risen to prominence. When a series of murders happens within Vienna high society, he teams up with a medium and a policeman to get to the bottom of things.

Frontier – *Canada* – 2016 to 2018 - In 18th-century North America, trappers and traders try to gain control in the fur trade.

Get Even – 2020 - At the elite Bannerman Independent School, a group of teenage girls band together to expose bullies and fight for justice. It's all going rather well until one of their targets is murdered and found holding a note pointing the finger at their group.

Glitch – *Australia* – 2015 to 2019 - In a small Australian town, seven local residents return from the dead in perfect condition.

H2O: Just Add Water – 2009 - A group of young girls deal with turning into mermaids.

Haven – *Canada* – 2010 to 2015 - In Haven, Maine, residents deal with a steady stream of supernatural difficulties. FBI agent Audrey Parker attempts to get to the bottom of it all.

Heartland – *Canada* – 2007 to present - A young woman deals with the stress of potentially losing the family ranch after the sudden death of her mother.

The Innocents – 2018 - Two teenage lovers find themselves in a world of trouble when one begins to show unexplainable abilities.

Land Girls - 2009 to 2011 - Land Girls follows four women in the Women's Land Army during WW2.

The Last Kingdom – 2020 - Set in the days of Alfred the Great, this Netflix Original takes us on one man's quest to reclaim his birthright.

Last Tango in Halifax – 2012 to present - Once upon a time, they were in love. Now, decades later, they meet again for a second chance. This time, there's a lot more baggage.

The Letter for the King - 2020 - Based on the 1962 Dutch novel *De brief voor de Koning* by Tonke Dragt, this series follows an aspiring knight as he attempts to deliver a secret letter to the king.

London Spy – 2015 - After his lover disappears, a fun-loving young man dives into the dangerous world of espionage.

Merlin - 2009 to 2013 - Colin Morgan (*The Fall*) stars as a young Merlin in his days as a mere servant to Prince Arthur of Camelot. In this version of Camelot, magic is banned and Merlin is forced to keep his talent hidden away.

Peaky Blinders – 2014 to present - Set in early 20th century Birmingham, this series focuses on gang boss Tommy Shelby and his family.

Pine Gap – *Australia* – 2018 - At a top-secret US and Australian defense facility, the alliance begins to show strain.

Rake - *Australia* - 2011 to 2018 - Defense lawyer Cleaver Greene makes a career out of hopeless cases, perhaps because his own personal life is troubled enough to help him relate.

The Rain - *Denmark* - 2018 to 2020 - After a virus wipes out most of the world's population, two siblings battle to survive their new reality.

Rebellion – 2016 - During WWI, three Irish women must choose sides in the revolt against English rule.

Republic of Doyle – *Canada* – 2010 to 2014 - Jake and Malachy Doyle are a father and son PI team in Newfoundland.

Secret City – *Australia* – 2016 - One student's protest leads to government scandal.

Skins – 2007 to 2013 - This racy classic offers a look into modern teenage life in England.

Top Boy – 2019 to present - This gritty drama focuses on drug dealers in London

public housing. See also: *Top Boy* – *Summerhouse*.

Travelers – *Canada* – 2016 to 2018 - In the far future, special agents are tasked with traveling back in time to prevent the collapse of society.

Troy: Fall of a City – 2018 - This miniseries is a retelling of the siege of Troy, loosely based on the Iliad.

The Tudors – 2007 to 2010 - This series follows Henry VIII in 16th-century England.

Van Helsing – *Canada* – 2016 to present - After waking up from a coma, a young woman finds the world ravaged by vampires.

Wanderlust – 2018 - A middle-aged couple decides the answer to their marital doldrums is to see other people. Toni Collette and Steven Mackintosh star.

Watership Down – 2018 - This modern-day retelling of the British classic features a warren of rabbits on a daring journey to find a new place to call home.

Wentworth – *Australia* – 2013 to present - An innocent woman has to figure out how to survive in prison while awaiting trial for the murder of her husband.

The Witcher - 2019 - Henry Cavill stars in this upcoming series about a solitary monster hunter in a world full of wicked people. It's been billed as Netflix's attempt at a *Game of Thrones*-style series, and it's already been renewed for a second season. The series is based on the book series of the same name by Andrzej Sapkowski.

Wyonna Earp – *Canada* – 2016 to present - A descendant of Wyatt Earp teams up with an immortal Doc Holiday in this supernatural comic-inspired Wild West tale.

Comedies

After Life – 2019 to present - After losing his wife to cancer, a suicidal widower struggles to come to terms with his new life. Starring Ricky Gervais (in a series that will surprise many, especially those who aren't normally fans of Gervais).

Bad Education – 2012 to 2014 - In a fictional Hertfordshire school, teacher Alfie Wickers fails miserably at educating his students. *See also: The Bad Education Movie*

Borderline – 2016 to 2018 - This comedy follows an inept team of border patrol agents at a fictitious airport.

Botterstones and Gumbles - 2015 to present - Set in and near a junkyard, this animated programme sees the fun-loving Gumbles attempting to steer clear of the smelly Botterstones. Unfortunately, Netflix decided to re-dub the series with American accents.

Burnistoun – 2010 to 2019 - This Scottish sketch comedy is set in a fictional town near Glasgow.

Chewin' the Fat – 1999 - This irreverent Scottish sketch comedy was mostly filmed in Glasgow.

Crashing – 2016 - A group of young people live as property guardians in an unused hospital in London. Phoebe Waller-Bridge (*Fleabag*) stars.

Crazyhead – 2016 - 20-somethings work on becoming adults while also battling demons in this comedy.

Cuckoo – 2012 to 2019 - When a British woman brings an American hippie back home as her husband, it sets off turmoil in her polite and proper family.

Danger Mouse - 2015 to present - These modern episodes see Danger Mouse and hamster Penfold returning for more jet-setting spy adventures.

Danger Mouse: Classic Collection - 1981 to 1992 - This collection of classic episodes features the spy Danger Mouse and his sidekick Penfold as they foil evil plots around the world.

Dennis and Gnasher Unleashed - 2017 - This cartoon follows fearless Dennis, his dog Gnasher, and his friends as they seek out fun and adventure around their town.

Derek – 2012 to 2014 - Ricky Gervais stars in this comedy about a good-hearted but slow nursing home care assistant.

Derry Girls – 2018 to present - This Northern Irish sitcom takes place in 1990s Derry, where a group of young women grow up during the Troubles.

Extras – 2005 to 2007 - Ricky Gervais (*The Office*) stars as an actor reduced to working as an extra, forever making himself look bad as he attempts to get ahead.

Flowers – 2016 to 2018 - Olivia Colman and Julian Barratt star in this dark comedy about a very troubled English family.

Hoff the Record – 2015 to 2016 - This David Hasselhoff mockumentary sees him attempting to make a comeback in the UK.

The Inbetweeners – 2008 to 2010 - A comedy that follows four friends as they navigate their final years of school and entrance into adulthood.

The IT Crowd – 2006 to 2013 - Banished to the basement, two nerds and their clueless

leader service the IT needs of a strange and generic corporation.

Jack Whitehall at Large – 2017 - This hour-long comedy special features the standup work of comedian Jack Whitehall.

Jack Whitehall: Christmas With My Father – 2019 - This Christmas special sees Jack Whitehall NOT travelling with his father – instead, taking the stage in London's West End with a host of celebrity guests.

Jack Whitehall: I'm Only Joking - 2020 - Comedian Jack Whitehall talks about life in hotels, human stupidity, and of course, his father.

Jack Whitehall: Travels with My Father – 2017 to present - A man and his father have little in common, but they come together as they travel around the world.

James Acaster: Repertoire – 2018 - This collection features four performances from quirky comedian James Acaster.

Kath & Kim – *Australia* – 2002 to 2007 - A quirky mother and daughter pair lead an interesting life in the suburbs of Melbourne.

Kim's Convenience – *Canada* – 2016 to present - This sitcom focuses on a Korean family that runs a small convenience store in Toronto

The Letdown – *Australia* – 2019 - A new mum meets strange friends in a new parents support group.

Limmy's Show – 2012 - This Scottish sketch comedy show sees Brian Limond playing roles like a TV psychic and costumed adventurer.

Loaded – 2017 - After four friends sell their startup for \$300 million, life gets a bit more difficult. This series is based on the popular Israeli series *Mesudarim* (which is often described as an Israeli version of *Silicon Valley meets Entourage*).

Man Down – 2013 to 2017 - Dan is a child trapped in a man's body, and he's not loving adulthood.

Man Like Mobeen – 2017 to present - In Small Heath, Birmingham, Mobeen tries to be a good Muslim and make sure his sister grows up on the straight and narrow, despite his past as a drug dealer.

Meet the Adebajjos – 2012 to present - In South London, a Nigerian father tries to

teach traditional African values to his modern British family – with entertaining results.

Monty Python's Almost the Truth – 2009 - Though this is technically a documentary, it made sense to include it here alongside the other Monty Python titles.

Monty Python and the Holy Grail – 1975 - King Arthur and his knights seek the Holy Grail, but they're not very well-suited to the task.

Monty Python Before the Flying Circus – 2000 - This documentary takes a look at how six talented men became the groundbreaking troupe, Monty Python.

Monty Python Best Bits – 2014 - This series compiles clips + opinions from prominent comedians, many of whom considered Monty Python to be influential on their careers.

Monty Python Conquers America – 2008 - This documentary takes a look at how Monty Python shaped a number of American comedians.

Monty Python's Fliegender Zircus – 1972 - This collection of sketches was created for German television. A must-watch for serious Monty Python fans.

Monty Python's Flying Circus – 1969 to 1974 - The classic British sketch comedy is now streaming on Netflix.

Monty Python's Life of Brian – 1979 - More Monty Python fun revolving around a man who deals with a particularly nasty case of mistaken identity.

Monty Python Live at Aspen – 1998 - The men of Monty Python reunite to discuss the making of their iconic show.

Monty Python Live at the Hollywood Bowl – 1982 - Clips and animations feature in this live-to-tape performance of Monty Python's greatest hits.

Monty Python Live (Mostly): One Down, Five to Go – 2014 - Live from London in a sold-out final show, the remaining members of Monty Python reunited to reprise their old roles.

Monty Python's Personal Best – 2005 - Members of the Monty Python troupe select their favorite sketches.

Monty Python: The Meaning of Live – 2014 - After a lengthy hiatus, the Monty Python crew reunited for this live

performance.

Mr. Young – *Canada* – 2013 - After graduating at 14, a gifted young man returns to his high school as a teacher.

Pacific Heat – *Australia* – 2016 - This animated series features an unintelligent covert squad that handles crime on Australia's Gold Coast.

People Just Do Nothing – 2014 to 2018 - This mockumentary follows some very bad wannabe MCs from West London.

Rita - *Denmark* - 2017 to present - Danish schoolteacher Rita may be popular with her students, but she struggles with adults.

Schitt's Creek – *Canada* – 2015 to 2020 - After a wealthy family loses everything, they attempt to rebuild in the small town they once bought their son as a birthday gift gag.

Sex Education – 2019 to present - Though technically British, there's something VERY American-feeling about this series. It's a series about a socially awkward teen whose mother is a sex therapist.

Shaun the Sheep: Adventures from Mossy Bottom - 2020 - This classic animated programme features clever sheep Shaun, Bitzer the dog, and his friends at Mossy Bottom.

Sick Note – 2018 - When an aimless young man is misdiagnosed with cancer, his life starts to get exciting.

Simon Amstell: Set Free – 2019 - If you enjoyed *Grandma's House*, you might like this standup set from comedian Simon Amstell (star and co-writer of the British comedy). He's an introspective comic, and this set dives into love, ego, intimacy, and ayahuasca.

Some Assembly Required – *Canada* – 2015 - A teenager takes over control of a toy company.

Still Game – 2002 to 2019 - Scottish comedy about three old men in a Glasgow highrise.

Sunny Bunnies - 2015 to present - These furry, colourful bunnies seek fun and mischief wherever they go in this children's series.

Toast of London – 2013 to 2015 - A classically trained British actor struggles with both his personal and professional lives.

Trailer Park Boys – Canada – 2001 to present - This trailer park comedy follows a group of men in constant pursuit of a big score and an easier life. See also: *The Movie*, *The Animated Series*, *Countdown to Liquor Day*, *Out of the Park: USA*, *Out of the Park: Europe*, *Say Goodnight to the Bad Guys*, and *Live in F**kin Dublin*.

Turn Up Charlie - 2019 - Idris Elba (*Luther*) stars as Charlie, a struggling DJ and confirmed bachelor. When he sees a possible upside for his career, he reluctantly agrees to play nanny to a good friend's dreadful young daughter. Piper Perabo (*Coyote Ugly*) stars as his famous friend Sara.

Scrotal Recall (aka Lovesick) – 2014 to 2018 - After finding out he has an STD, a young man must attempt to contact former lovers.

Sisters – Australia – 2018 - A young woman suddenly finds out she has two sisters and more than 100 brothers.

W1A – 2014 to 2017 - This mockumentary-style show follows the new head of values at the BBC. Hugh Bonneville (*Downton Abbey*) stars, and the series features numerous cameos.

White Gold – 2017 to 2019 - This period comedy takes place in 1980s Essex, where obnoxious salesman Vincent Swan and his team do whatever it takes to sell double-glazed windows.

The Windsors – 2016 to present - This mockumentary parodies the current British royal family.

Workin' Moms – Canada – 2017 to present - When their (remarkably long Canadian) maternity leaves are over, a group of moms return to work.

The Worst Witch – 2017 to present - This young adult comedy follows a bumbling young witch who accidentally stumbles into witching school.

Documentary & Lifestyle

100% Hotter – 2017 - A team of professional stylists come together to help some of Britain's worst fashion disasters.

21 Again - 2019 - A group of young women disguise their mothers as 21-year-olds and send them out into the wild.

3 Wives, One Husband – 2018 - Originally created for British audiences, this series takes a look at modern polygamist families in Utah.

Amazing Interiors – 2018 - This British show travels the world to visit eccentric homeowners and their eccentric homes.

Baby Ballroom – 2018 - This series goes deep into the cutthroat world of children's ballroom dancing (which we didn't realise existed).

Battlefield Recovery – 2016 - In this series, a four-man team visits Latvia and Poland to unearth World War II artifacts and help uncover new truths about the conflict.

Behind Enemy Lines – 2001 - This series takes a look at some of the changes Winston Churchill instituted after WWII setbacks in 1940. He set out to create a force powered by intelligence, stealth, and

cunning more than ruthless brute force, and it paid off.

The Big Family Cooking Showdown – 2017 to present - This unscripted reality show brings us some of Britain's most passionate amateur cooks.

The Big Flower Fight – 2020 - This one is best described as "the Great British Bake Off meets the RHS Chelsea Flower Show".

Cabins in the Wild with Dick Strawbridge – 2017 - An engineer and craftsman tour a set of unique cabins in Wales, then build their own.

Caught on Camera – 2015 - This series shows crimes caught on CCTV and cell phones, and how technology is used to solve otherwise unsolvable cases.

Churchill's Secret Agents: The New Recruits - 2018 - This reality series takes 14 modern contestants through the same selection process used for World War II spies.

Click for Murder – 2017 - This docuseries takes a look at the deadly dangers that lurk within the bowels of the internet.

Cocaine – 2005 - This series takes a look at

the cocaine industry and its impact on people of all walks of life.

The Code – 2011 - Not to be confused with the fictional TV series, this three-part documentary looks at the mathematics behind all of life.

Conspiracies – 2015 - This series dives into a number of potential coverups and secrets.

Crazy Delicious - 2020 - This food competition show rewards talented home chefs with a golden apple.

Edge of the Universe – 2008 - Astronomers reveal the latest discoveries about the world beyond Earth's atmosphere.

Everyday Miracles – 2014 - Scientist Mark Miodownik highlights the everyday miracles that make modern life so much better than the not-so-distant past.

Genius of the Ancient World – 2015 - Historian Bettany Hughes travels the world to study the lives of philosophers like Socrates, Confucius, and Buddha.

Genius of the Modern World – 2016 - Historian Bettany Hughes looks at the world that helped shape intellectual greats like Friedrich Nietzsche, Sigmund Freud, and Karl Marx.

Glow Up – 2020 - This series aims to see who can take the sexiest selfie – and the loser gets a makeover.

Grand Designs – 1999 to present- This British reality show that follows people as they attempt to build or massively overhaul homes.

The Great British Baking Show – 2010 to present - This popular British baking show sees amateurs facing off and trying to avoid the dreaded soggy bottom.

The Great British Baking Show: The Beginnings - 2012 - A dozen amateur bakers compete on this early edition of the Great British Baking Show.

Greatest Events of WWII in Colour – 2019 - This series also takes a look at WWII footage that's been restored with colour.

History 101 – 2020 - This educational series offers short history lessons for those challenged in the “attention span” department – everything from fast food to plastics to the space race and the rise of China.

Hitler's Circle of Evil – 2017 - This docuseries takes a look at the power struggles, plots, and betrayals that took place behind the scenes within Nazi leadership.

How to Live Mortgage Free with Sarah Beeny – 2018 - Sarah Beeny talks to people who've managed to free themselves of a mortgage or monthly rental payment.

I Am a Killer – 2020 - This show goes to America, where capital punishment is still legal, and listen to the stories of Death Row inmates.

Inside the Freemasons – 2017 - This brief series takes a look inside the free and often controversial Freemasons.

Inside the Real Narcos – 2018 - Ex-Special Forces commando Jason Fox takes us inside the world of drug traffickers and cartel members.

Inside the World's Toughest Prisons – 2016 to present - Journalists put themselves inside – behind bars – in some of the world's roughest prisons.

Interior Design Masters – 2019 - Aspiring interior designers transform a variety of spaces in a competition to win a contract with a fashionable London hotel.

The Investigator: A British Crime Story – 2018 - This British true crime series features criminologist Mark Williams-Thomas as he examines unsolved murders.

The Irish Mob – Ireland – 2016 - This series focuses on the rise of the Irish Mob in America.

Killer Women with Piers Morgan – 2017 - Women commit just a tiny fraction of all murders, making female murderers a particularly interesting group for study. Who are they? Why do they do it? Piers Morgan takes a closer look.

Million Pound Menu – 2019 - Young restaurateurs open pop-up restaurants in hopes of attracting and impressing investors.

Murder Maps – 2017 - Dramatic reenactments of famous British murders.

My Hotter Half – 2017 - Couples compete to see which member of the pair can take the better selfie.

Nadiya's Time to Eat – 2020 - Nadiya Hussain shows how modern families can make great food with limited time.

Nurses Who Kill – 2016 - While nurses are an overwhelmingly good and compassionate group of people, a handful use their positions to hurt, rather than heal. This series takes a look at what motivates them.

Operation Ouch - 2012 - This entertaining series takes a lighthearted approach to educating children about doctor visits and medical procedures.

The Repair Shop – 2017 to present - This delightfully calm series follows a group of craftspeople who help restore objects of importance, many of them antique.

The Royal House of Windsor – 2017 - This docuseries analyzes the British royal family's ability to hold onto power over the last century of struggles and changes.

Secrets of Great British Castles – 2016 - Documentary-style program highlighting some of the largest and most historically-important castles around Great Britain (including Stirling, York, and Edinburgh, among others).

Serial Killer with Piers Morgan – 2018 - Piers Morgan takes a closer look at three convicted serial killers and their crimes.

Stunt Science – 2018 - This series looks at the science behind daredevil stunts.

Sunderland 'Til I Die – 2020 - This docuseries follows the Sunderland Association Football Club through the 2017-2018 season as they try to make a big comeback.

They've Gotta Have Us – 2018 - This series interviews black entertainers to trace the history of black cinema.

Win the Wilderness – 2020 - This reality show pits six couples against each other to see who has the best survival skills. The winning couple gets the deed to a home in the wilds of Alaska.

Witches: A Century of Murder – 2015 - Historian Suzannah Lipscomb looks at the British witch hunts of the 17th century.

The World's Most Extraordinary Homes – 2017 to present - Caroline Quentin (*Jonathan Creek*) and architect Piers Taylor travel the world to view extraordinary and unusual homes.

World War II in Colour – 2009 - In this 13-episode series, WWII footage is restored and given new life – in colour.
